

As we prepare to celebrate our 75th Anniversary in 2020, we reflect on our 2019 Season. This year was full of music, community events, and reflection.

Cathedral of the Pines implemented suggestions from our Community Leadership Meeting which brought us a musical event each month. Michael T. Brown III did "Singing All My Favorites". We also hosted the Wesley Bell Ringers, a Monadnock Music Town House Concert," Sounds of Summer" with Trio di Natura, Decatur Creek, Keene Cheshiremen Barbershop Chorus and Half Annie.

Our partnership with Franklin Pierce University brought in a lecture series. Dr. Robert Goodby, Dr. Mary Kelly, and Dr. Jacques Veilleux of FPU, along with Ann-Maria Contarino of NH Humanities to Go Program and St. Anselm College gave thoughtful lectures on a variety of subjects.

In 2019 Cathedral of the Pines proudly awarded the title of Trustee Emeritus to Jed Brummer and Donald Upton.

Jed Brummer has Cathedral of the Pines in his blood. His mother was Margaret Sloane Brummer, daughter of Douglas



and Sibyl Sloane and sister to Sanderson "Sandy" Sloane. Jed grew up at the Cathedral, riding his horse here as teenager to help his grandfather maintain the grounds. He feels he has had a lifelong obligation to help maintain the memory of his family through Cathedral of the Pines. He learned through his

grandparents how important being involved in your community is. While the Cathedral was created as a memorial first to Sandy, it was also meant to bring people of all faiths together as community. Jed has been on the Board of Trustees since the 1970's where he has held all positions as well as being the Co-Chairman with Margaret Bean. He was Chairman for three years, including when the Ice Storm of 2008 devastated the area and the Cathedral. Jed was instrumental in resurrecting Cathedral of the Pines after the storm and he believes the Cathedral of the Pines represents "All Faiths, One Family, One Earth".



Donald Upton became connected to Cathedral of the Pines in 1995 when he married his wife Dorrie here. He became an Incorporator in 2002, a Trustee in 2004 and served as the Chairman of the Board from 2011 through 2016, Treasurer for 2017 and 2018. For Don the military history of Cathedral is very important. His oldest

brother served in the U.S. Navy in WWII, middle brother served in the U. S. Coast Guard and Don served in the U. S. Air Force. He feels that Cathedral of the Pines honors those men and women who gave their lives, so we have the freedoms that we all enjoy today. Don's most important project was raising the funds for and overseeing the rebuilding of the Peter J. Booras Military History Museum. The museum is an integral part of the Cathedral of the Pines and is appreciated by all our guests. Don graduated from the University of Massachusetts with B.S. in Agriculture and minor in marketing. He began his career with Pfizer Pharmaceuticals and retired in 2001 after 29 years as the CEO of a large New England Farmer Cooperative.


Dick Putnam

Jefferson Brummer

Jefferson Brummer passed away on April 7, 2019 following a battle with cancer. Jeff, along with his twin brother Jed and sister Martha, spent much of their youth here at Cathedral of the Pines where they would help their grandfather Douglas Sloane maintain the grounds. Jeff was also known as a political activist. He directed the Granite State Alliance and was a founding member of the Clamshell Alliance. More recently he went to Standing Rock, ND to protest the Dakota Access pipeline and he joined the Poor People's Campaign in Washington, DC in 2018. Jeff was an avid skier and made the trip to Tuckerman's Ravine every spring. He is survived by his siblings, Jed and Martha, as well as his partner Kate Walker and son Ben Walker-Brummer.
